Friends of Gosport Museum might have been watching a recent BBC 2 television programme called 'Collectaholics'. One collection investigated was of a houseful of Pelham puppets. The collector was put in touch with the Norwich Puppet theatre with the idea that maybe the theatre might be interested in housing the collection, to their mutual benefit. The idea seemed to be working.

In learning about the history of Pelham Puppets, who should be interviewed outside the theatre but one of our own founder members, Miss Rosemarie Gibaud. It seems that Rosemarie had actually worked for some years in the firm in Marlborough at its very start in the late 1940's, She even recognised some of the early puppets that she had painted herself. She interviewed really well.

Rosemary was a staunch member of FoGM for many years until she moved to the Norwich area.

Rosemary Gibaud also added the interesting info that it was her idea for the interview to take place at the Norwich Puppet Theatre - the production team had been looking at Reading and London for some reason without success The N.P.Theatre was ideal as it was so relevant to the subject and geographically convenient for Rosemarie.
