

Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of the Friends of Gosport Museum
Thursday 5 May 2016

1. Apologies – Sydney Aynsworth, Jack Poole, Brenda Whiteley
2. The minutes of the AGM held on 7 May 2015 were proposed by Yvonne Riddell and seconded by Linda Hedley
3. Matters Arising – the minutes should read
 - i. That the screen for the Museum will be ‘commissioned by’ not ‘purchased by’ the Hampshire Cultural Trust
 - ii. Volunteers are needed for the Gallery
 - iii. We had three free tickets to talks at the Gosport Discovery Centre
4. Chairman’s Report – this was a compilation by the chairman and vice-chairman owing to the chairman’s illness: FoGM membership is steady and finances satisfactory. Six volunteers continue to help at Search and Jack Poole stewards at the Museum when he is available. Work in stores has continued where 3 members have been transcribing the diary of Martha Tottenham. Morning meetings have attracted about 6 members. In September Maggie Ventham helped the curator to show ‘Treasures from the Museum on the first 2015 Heritage Open Day. The Gosport Gallery remains at risk of closure owing to lack of volunteers. More are needed to keep this valuable Gosport asset open.

In March we said goodbye to Erica Munro, curator for SE Hants, when she moved to a new post at Bletchley Park. Her departure was followed by that of CELO Janet Wildman who has taken early retirement.

The future funding of the Trust, by HCC and partners such as GBC, will be reduced to about a third by 2020 in line with reductions in central government funding for local authorities. In its first full year of life the Cultural Trust has worked hard to maintain the standards we’ve come to expect, but the future of Arts, Museums and Galleries will depend on volunteers and increased support from donations, sponsorship and commercial enterprises. 9. Project Report: the funds are available to purchase the screen for the Museum but it is not known whether it was commissioned by the Curator before her departure despite attempts to find out. The Vice-Chairman signed an application for a Heritage Lottery Grant in the autumn of 2015 on behalf of FoGM. The proposed project was to support 'Gosport's Hidden High Street' exhibition through the Ashcroft Arts Centre at Fareham. The project would have involved the Young Roots Scheme which encourages the next generation to appreciate culture. It is not certain whether this will still go ahead. Members will be asked to steward the Museum on 8 September, the first day of the Gosport Heritage Open Days. Maggie Ventham
