Report from the Chair

Welcome to our winter newsletter, best wishes for 2022 and fewer problems with Covid! Wendy's report will tell you about progress with the re-development of the Gosport Museum and Art Gallery building. The work to create a Cultural Hub may be done in stages so some volunteering in the stores could continue there. The venue's Gallery volunteers will be at the shop in the High St from February. It's important to keep in contact with them and with regular visitors. The premises are not far from the ferry, on the north side of the street. This rented shop needs professional repairing – the initial effort made by Wendy and her staff to move in before Xmas had to be abandoned.

Progress to re-home the collections in the Search room-sets is nearly over. Gosport Museum's own educational material and objects, which were used at Search, have been re-purposed or returned to the store rooms. To re-use some of this collection Wendy has created 'Memory Boxes'. These are themed collections. The 'Evening Out on The Town Box' for example contains clothes, accessories, theatre programmes etc. The Boxes will encourage conversation and exchange of memories between people and will be available for group meetings in communities and at the Hub. Dot Bedenham and I have been listing the contents of each box. The staff will track the objects for museum recording and make labels listing the contents for each box. When Janet Wildman who managed Search for a long time was helping Wendy, a few items in the boxes were mysteries to us but Janet came to our rescue and identified them. Do <u>you</u> have a 'runcible spoon' aka a spork? It's a spoon with 2 or 3 prongs at the tip for spearing and scooping simultaneously – it's in the Box of Curiosities!

The collections from Gosport, destined to be on show in the new museum, have been packed and transported to HQ at Chilcomb to be properly conserved ready for showing. Bryony Hope from the HCT Fundraising Team would like to meet us at some time to talk about the use of our donation, which was Margaret Roberts' bequest to us, and given for the new museum. Bryony is probably available on Tuesdays, and most likely we would meet at the shop unless there is a chance to see what has been done in the old building.

The Gosport Society will be publishing a book later this year about the Heritage and Conservation of Gosport. I was asked to contribute a chapter about the History of Gosport Museum and agreed to do so. This has been edited for inclusion, it remains to select 3 or 4 photos – do let me know asap if you have any suitable ones. Maggie Ventham 21/01/22

Venue Managers News (from Message to Volunteers)

Building update. We have exciting news with a confirmed date of 31st January for the building work to begin. The building will be closing down, and items being packed away week commencing 24th January so this will be a very busy week in the venue. The delivery of school sessions will continue up until 21st January in our venue then be moving to the Submarine Museum from February. Room hire will be continuing up until 27th January. The building will be re-opening in August 2022 as long as there are no major problems with the works. The Schools Loans Box service will be continuing throughout the move and relocation to the shop unit.

Work on the shop unit to get it fully up and running has started. The priority will be to get the front and middle part of the unit, which will be using for Creative retail and our activities, ready to open week commencing 7th February. The shop will be open Tuesday to Saturday 10am-4pm.

We have been approached by the University of Portsmouth to find volunteers to be involved in a focus group here in the venue. The University of Portsmouth in collaboration with Gosport Borough Council are conducting a Feasibility and Needs Analysis of Gosport heritage and community engagement. Wendy Redman

A Blast from the Past

Maggie Ventham and I often work together when we are volunteering at the Museum. We have recently been given the task of sorting through a collection of framed items. These include paintings but also certificates, posters and photographs. It's a task we have really enjoyed, finding the occasional delight and, for me, one very big surprise. I worked for Chelmsford Borough Council as a museum curator for 27 years, so you can imagine how I felt when we came across a letter headed "Borough of Chelmsford", dated June 1930 and signed by the then Mayor of Chelmsford, John Ockelford Thompson. The letter, ornately decorated and bearing the borough seal, was written to thank Mr James Taylor Beetson for his services to the town as Deputy Borough Accountant on the occasion of his departure to become Borough Treasurer of Gosport.

I know a lot about John Ockelford Thompson. I researched his life as part of a project in which I was involved. He was editor and part-proprietor of the local newspaper, the Essex Chronicle. He served on the town council for many years and was elected mayor of the town on seven occasions. He was about to become mayor for the eighth time when a German high explosive bomb was dropped on his house, killing Thompson and other members of his family. It was the night of 13th October 1940, the Battle of Britain was waging, and Chelmsford was the target that night. It was a sad end to a noble career.

I think I now need to find out more about James Taylor Beetson who moved down to Gosport from Chelmsford, just as I did but 82 years later. Dot Bedenham

I have received a letter from Robert Herbert who livesin California United States of America, who is a collector of British medals, mainly the Royal Navy.




He has a Great War trio of medals awarded to William John Gamblin, a former stoker in the Royal Navy. He was born and lived in Gosport, also from 1911 to 1942 (his death) was a Licensed Victualler at a pub called the Sun Tavern at 39 North Street Gosport. He has also sent information about his time in the Navy from 1893 and newspaper articles about his life, which I could add or send on to members who are interested.

Robert knows the North Street area has been redeveloped since then, but would like to see photographs of the North Street area from before the redevelopment but does not need to be back to 1946 or before. The second escape was when H.M.S. Good Hope sailed from Halifax Nova Scotia on her last voyage, leaving Mr. Gamblin and ether members of the voyage. several other members of

crew behind. Mr. <u>Gamblin</u>, who was Acting C.P.O. stoker, and several mem-bers of the crew took a steam-boat ashore and when they re-boat ashore and when they rebest of the crew took a steam boat ashore and when they re-turned the Good Hope had sailed. At the end of his normal term of service—he retired in Novem-ber 1907 and was recalled for the Great War—Mr. Gamblin was in the Submarine Service and was in B11 one of the earliest of the underwater craft. As well as serv-ing in H.M.S Good Hope he was also present at the Dardanelles during the campaign there and also the evacuation. He was de-mobilized in March 1919. Mrs. Gamblin recalling the ex-periences of the last war said: "He went cut in the morning of August 2, 1914 and said, 'So long. shall be back to dinner,' and I did not see him again for three wars and sight days."
