## Russell

I am currently researching my great grandfather's second world war service history. He was in the 215 Battery of the 57th Wessex Heavy Anti Aircraft Regiment, based in Gosport.

I have established the 215 would drill out of the drill hall on Walpole Road. I understand the drill hall was demolished in the 70s, but I have found reference to a memorial bench dedicated to 215, also said to located on Walpole Road. I have had a look around the area and cannot locate it. I am wondering if you or any of your members would have any knowledge of this bench i.e. Was is removed as part of the drill hall demolition or perhaps moved to a new location. Any information anyone has would be gratefully received.

## Angela

I would be grateful for any words of advice with a current puzzle. I am looking to find records from a Naval School at Gosport called Burney's Academy, Gosport Academy and also Dr Burney's Royal Academy. It was a school opened by Burney in 1791 and run by his sons and a grandson and later closed in 1904. I understand that your school has a naval background and as I'm a bit stuck as to where to look next hoped to ask for advice.

The school trained young boys to take naval entrance examinations and was under patronage of Queen Victoria, her husband and two of her sons the then Prince of Wales and Duke of Connaught. I am particularly looking for pupil roles or records between 1824 and 1840 as part of my research into a particular family. I have tried to approach the national maritime museums but found that quite complex with redirects. I have also tried the Royal Hospital school in Sussex that I believe has links in the past to Greenwich.

#### Tim

My nephew (aged 17) is highly motivated by investigating family history. This is partly his way of coping with his grandfather's death last September. We have established that a distant relative was an outfitter in North Cross Street around 1880.

Could you advise me how I could access some photos of the street or information about him? My nephew lives in Worthing and I live in Derbyshire but I visit from time to time. I'm keen to develop his interest in history.

I wonder if you can help me or give me a contact regarding the burial place of Chick Henderson, the singer. I believe his gravestone will be in his birth name of Henderson Rowntree. I was born in West Hartlepool and my aunt and Chick's aunt were cousins. Mary Boagey, nee Rowntree visited us quite a lot....I didn't realise, until I began genealogy studies, that he died in Portsmouth and was buried in St Lukes cemetery Haslar. I would like to visit St Lukes. My grandson will keep me company. When the weather improves...

I went to St Cecilias school for girls Alverstoke for a few years, I cant find any trace or photos of it. It would have been the late fifties or early sixties I am now in my 75 year and trying to write about my past for my grandchildren I can remember our school uniform was blue with a sax blue scull cap in winter with a grey outer coat and a boater in summer with a blue blazer. Our head teacher had or was a concert pianist and as far as I remember she had a lovely sports car. We played lacrosse on a green a short walk from school and I cycled in from home when dry.
